



10 Tips for Family Caregivers

Over 90 million Americans today are family caregivers for their loved ones; and a

large number of them are finding themselves providing care 24-hours a day/7-days a week. Although caregiving can be a rewarding experience, it is not without its consequences such as stress, poor health, and caregiver burnout.

Six out of 10 family caregivers juggle everyday life tasks such as preparing the children for school, managing household responsibilities, and work full- or part-time. In addition, they have the added responsibility of managing medications for their loved one. Whether it be for a senior with Alzheimer's or a child with special needs the required attention can be non-stop. Caregiving affects the whole family. Family time and mealtime are extremely important in the caregiving setting. Ensuring that the caregiver and family members get the proper nutrition is important for maintaining strength, energy, stamina, and a positive attitude. Making time for yourself and the family protects a family caregiver's own health, strengthens family relationships, prevents burnout and can enable a care recipient to stay at home up to three times longer. The chance to take a breather and re-energize is vital in order for you to be as good a caregiver tomorrow as you were today.

- 1. **Seek support from other caregivers.** You are not alone!
- 2. **Take care of your own health** so that you can be strong enough to take care of your loved one.
- 3. **Accept offers of help** and suggest specific things people can do to help you.
- 4. Learn how to communicate effectively with doctors.
- 5. Caregiving is hard work so take respite breaks often.
- 6. Watch out for **signs of depression** and don't delay getting professional help when you need it.
- 7. Be open to **new technologies** that can help you care for your loved one.
- 8. **Organize medical information** so it's up to date and easy to find.
- 9. Make sure legal documents are in order.
- 10. Give yourself credit for doing the best you can in one of the toughest jobs there is!
