



What inspires you? It is a questions that may be worth some time and reflection. And likely you will come up with more than a simple, singular response. I know the views in this place we call home can be inspiring. But so do stories that tell of people overcoming adversity. Likewise when I see photographs that reveal wonders of God's creation. Music can often be a source of inspiration. My children inspire me with their abilities and their care for others. Karen continues to inspire me in numerous ways.

Another question close to this first is: to what are you inspired? Where the first question asks to reflect on what touches us. This second question asks something of ourselves oriented outward; what difference are we making for someone or something other than ourselves. We may be inspired to serve our neighbor. We may be inspired to make a positive difference in the lives of young people; or the elderly; or people struggling to make ends meet with their limited resources. Perhaps we are inspired to seek positive change in public policy and become politically active. Or maybe we are inspired to clean up a stream and improve the habitat for the trout that may live there.

Inspiration is the work of the Holy Spirit. Inspiration is like breath, we take in a breath and exhale it too. It is rhythmic. Breathe in, breathe out, repeat. Of course spirit and inspire are related words. The Spirit of God shows us ourselves, what we need, who we are, what inspires us. The Spirit also show us our gifts: who we are, what we able to do, what interests us, where we find joy, how we are a gift to people around us, how we are generous.

Likely what you discover inspires you is related to that to which you are inspired. I don't believe the Holy Spirit inspires us to be hoarders of God's gifts. Rather the Spirit shows us our giftedness that we would recognize what it is God has given us to share, and to whom.

June 9th is Pentecost, the annual festival in which we recall the dramatic presence of the Holy Spirit fifty days after the resurrection of our Lord Jesus. This Spirit was promised to be a helper, an advocate. This Spirit of God inspires faith in each of us, reminding us that our faith is a gift from God, not something we go out and acquire on our own. Yet as with other gifts we value, tending that gift, using that gift, nurturing that gift are all part of the blessing of the gift.

What inspires you and to what are you inspired? It is a Pentecost question. May you experience joy in seeking and sharing the answers.

A little more on the water filters fund raiser, the goal of \$5,000 was exceeded! With the combined efforts of LOTV, LOTV's friends & family, Salem Lutheran in Stromberg, Nebraska, and Faith Lutheran in Hastings, Nebraska the total amount was \$6,591.75! Several of LOTV's Parish Partners took the need of clean water in rural Nicaragua to their home churches, which helped exceed the goal by encouraging their church members to participate in the fund raiser. The mission team will assist with the delivery of water filters on 6/22/2019, this is very exciting news to share with you, because our previous partner was not able to deliver the filters as in years past. By God's grace and providence we will assist with the delivery to a rural community through the assistance and coordination of Jorge Luis Rodriguez. More to come once the team returns to the USA!

Flanning Our Future Together | Part 3

The LOTV Strategic Planning Group is using Dr. Kennon Callahan's approach to ecumenical Strategic Planning as presented in his book entitled: <u>Twelve Keys to an Effective Church</u> (Josesey-Bass 2010). This is the third of three summaries that are based on Dr. Callahan's work and intended to help inform everyone regarding the foundations of the approach. Last month we considered the six relational characteristics and this month we will overview the six functional characteristics.

Six Key Functional Characteristics:

- 1. One Major Program The congregation has one major program that is among the best in the community and services many persons and families. Preferably there is a connection between the program and the major mission outreach. The emphasis is on a human hurt or hope, life stage, common interest, community concern or a combination of these. The leaders of the program are both person centered and program focused.
- 2. Open Accessibility The location of the church is excellent, links with the typical traffic direction and is within the average "trip times" for the community. The location is easily accessible both for entry and leaving. Likewise, the building has open, spacious entrances and exits. The general "feel" of the building is one of welcoming. The congregation conveys a feeling of "people" accessibility because of its compassion with the members, constituents, and those served in mission and in the community.
- 3. **High Visibility** The church location is very visible and displays helpful signs that communicate seasonal points of interest. Excellent communications visibility exists within the congregation and community (often reinforced by the first four relational characteristics). "People visibility" is enhanced within the community because of the congregation's excellent support of a worthwhile community project.
- 4. Land, Landscaping & Parking The church owns sufficient, usable land for both its present life and future missions. The landscaping helps create a first impression of an open, spacious, warm, welcoming, inviting group with a gracious spirit. The parking is adequate for normal Sunday and weekday use; and adequately accommodates the top ten major Sundays of the year.

On June 19th, Lord of the Valley will lead a 26 member Medical Team to Somoto, Nicaragua. While there we will: support the Lutheran Church in Caculi, deliver water filters, deliver layettes and medical supplies to the hospital in Somoto and the maternity house in Somoto; deliver school supplies and Spanish children's books to the schools in the communities; build relationships and provide for medical needs of families in rural communities (dental optical, and general medical clinics as well as children's ministry); work closely with local doctors and nurses. We appreciate your prayers for safe travel, a successful medical clinic, and sharing God's love with all people of all ages.
